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NOTES:

The interview was conducted using either Computer Assisted Self-Interviewing (CASI) or Computer Assisted Telephone Interviewing (CATI). In all cases, questions were accessed and answered via an electronic script held on the interviewer's laptop.

The script for the questionnaire uses a variety of 'textfills' to customise question wording so that it is appropriate to individual circumstances. All textfills are signalled in the paper questionnaire by the character '^'. For example, wherever the text reads ^he, the computer will substitute the appropriate pronoun; wherever the text reads ^CFName, the computer will substitute the child's actual name.

Questions are also often routed on key variables – e.g. gender of participant, whether they are part of a lone or two-parent household, etc. Routing is displayed in italics alongside the question/variable name.
